Social transformation through culture and nature

Understanding the local context: Vulnerability and Local Assets

- H&WB situation, past experiences, other projects and institutions working there
- **How?** Participatory workshops, interviews, focal groups, participatory observation.
 - Identify key informants, but avoid bias
 - **Door-to-door information** about the project
 - **Synergies** with other initiatives.



What to consider?

- **Skilled and experienced** people
- **Trust-building** and acceptance processes require a significant amount of **time** and **effort**.
- **Scepticism** and resistance due to previous failures.
- **Listen**
- Include all, especially the **traditionally excluded** or **neglected**.
- **Adapt** the working method to the needs, habits, and cultures.

Participatory Action Research methods to CO-design, CO-deploy, CO-manage and CO-monitor

Inclusive Governance structure: Cordoba IN-HUB

- **Polycentric, bottom-up, open, flexible**, fluid governance model (include local residents, the public sector, the private sector, and the research sector).
- Place to **shape interventions** and **ground decision-making** to the local needs and perspectives (social platform to promote structural dialogue, networking and collaboration).



Participatory Action Research methods to CO-design, CO-deploy, CO-manage and CO-monitor

Inclusive Governance structure: Cordoba IN-HUB

- **Co-creating an action plan:** Design Interventions combining Hard and Soft VIS.
- **Co-deploying actions:** Capacity Building and Co-Management.
- **Co-designing** an assessment framework.

Appropriation, sense of place, ownership



SOFT VIS IN THE NEIGHBOURHOOD

Soft VIS – Intangible processes and social/cultural actions:

- **Cultural and sociocultural activities** (e.g., cultural heritage events, sociocultural visits)
- **Health and well-being workshops** (e.g., well-being and self-esteem, healthy food)
- **Sport events** (e.g., La Milla race, youngsters' football training)
- **Educational and entrepreneurship workshops** (e.g., gardening, Entreplanos contest, AI, new technologies, B4B for entrepreneurs)
- **Culinary event** (e.g., Perol Gourmet)
- **Communication** (e.g., periodic radio program/videos)

- *The largest art street mural in Cordoba (400 m²)*



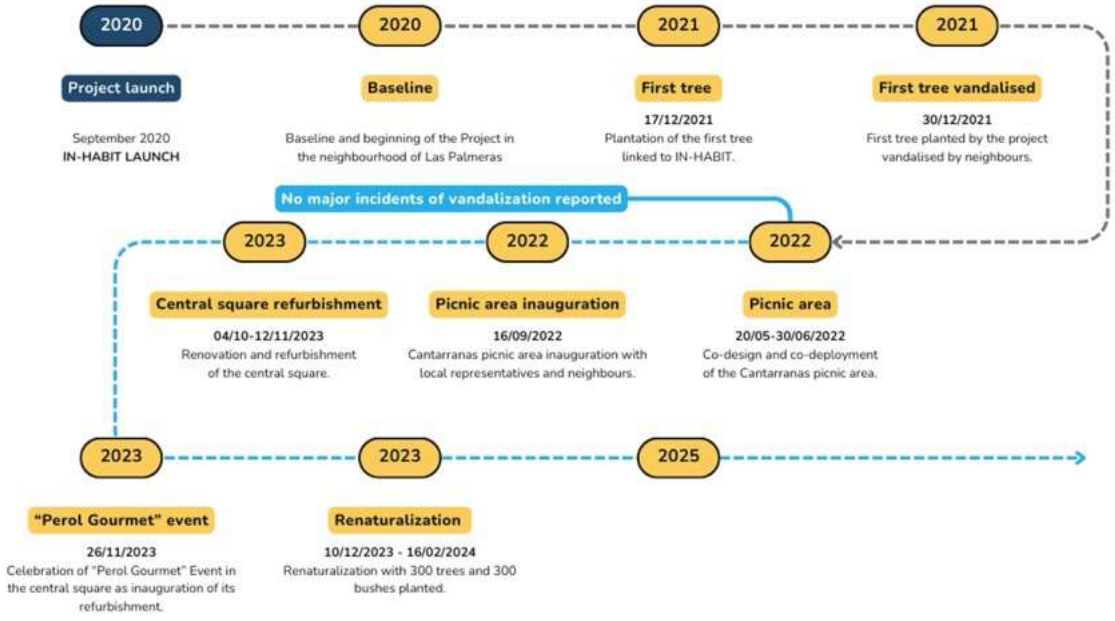
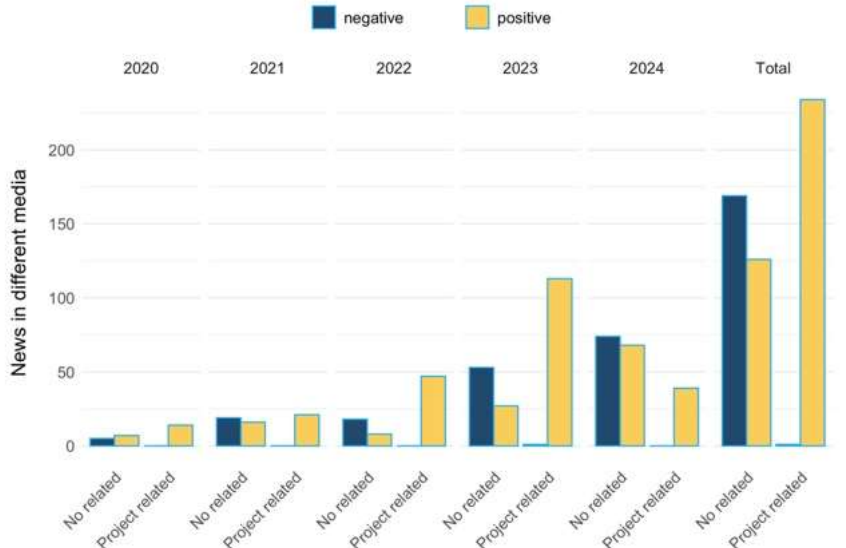

A more **cohesive community** with greater social skills among the homeless.

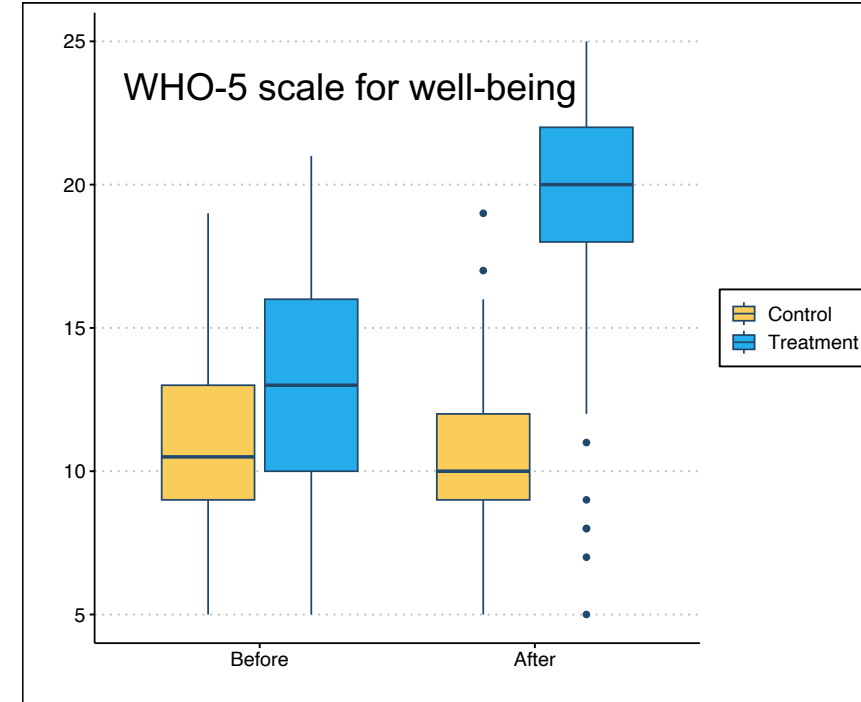
60 m² **urban garden** (produce distributed to low-income families).

Immersive experience to train people with disabilities



- **Culture and heritage** promote health and well-being.
- Transforming public spaces through **social activation**
- Acknowledge the **multiple dimensions** and views of IHW
- Make **visible** the invisible
- **Listen** to the people (they are the experts).
- **Bottom-up** approaches
- **Processes** of including vulnerable people (underserved neighbourhoods, homeless people, and people with disabilities) matter even more than final **outcomes**.
